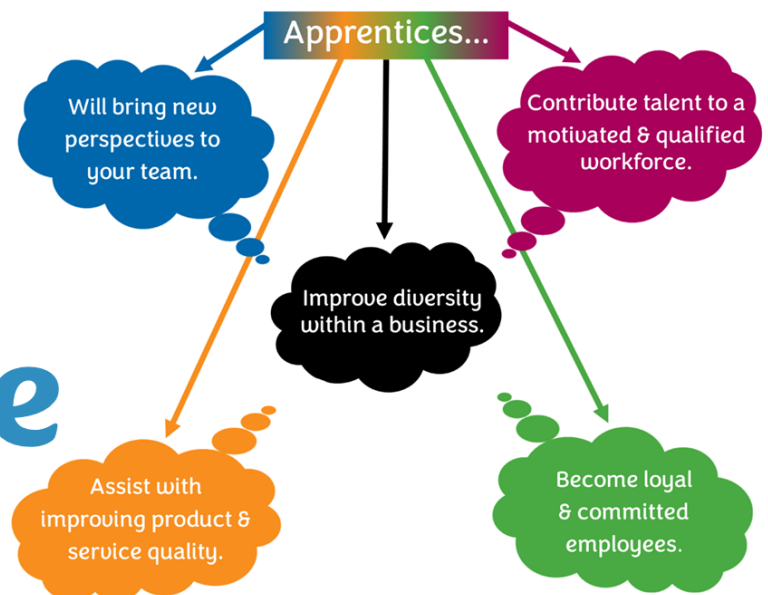


Why hire an apprentice?

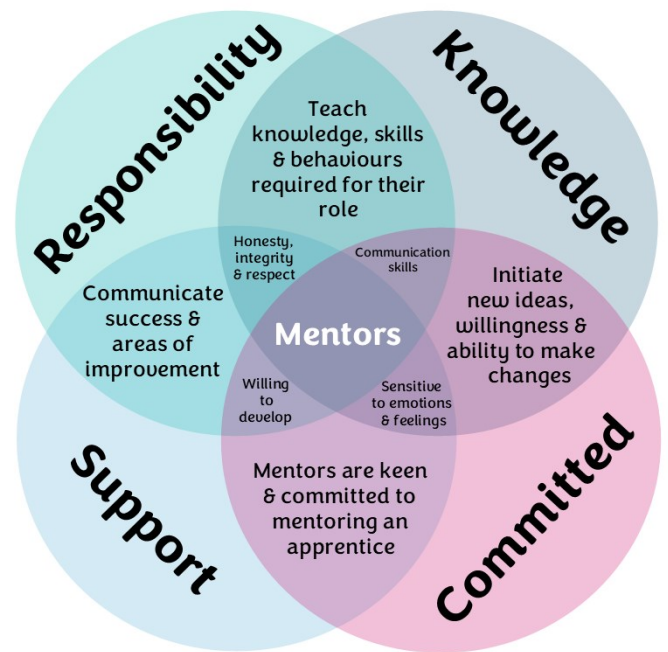
Apprentices will undertake training in the following ways:
